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DATA PROTECTION POLICY

HSC (Radio Telegraphy High Speed Club 1951) is not a registered club. It is a special interest group that issues a telegraphy award to radio amateurs worldwide The personal information required of the applicant is needed for printing, processing and mailing the award. The address information will not be used for purposes other than mailing the award or contacting the applicant as necessary. The address data will be stored in printed form only and not be publicly made accessible. It will not be used for commercial purposes whatsoever. However, the following core data will be digitally processed, used, and publicized for the purposes of fostering the goals of the special interest group HSC as outlined on its webpage and in particular promoting QRQ traffic in hamradio communications by issuing an award: Call/alternate call(s), first name, HSC no., status indicator. This core data set of HSC members may be referenced within a document or be part of a ranking (such as a score lists) or sorted lists which are made available to the general public for information. Addressing the afore-mentioned "general public" will predominantly involve the use of any one or all of the following media:

- a) HSC <u>internet</u> website <u>www.highspeedclub.org</u>: This is the official authoritative website of the HSC membership data will be used to generate and publish HSC member listings, summarized HSC contest results, Marathon results list, WHSC award owner lists.. There may also be feature articles of social getogethers (<u>see b) below</u>).
- b) newspaper/magazine articles: HSC members' data and photos of HSC members may be used as part of an article in a special interest magazine such as "CQDL,", "Funkamateur". This includes articles in general print media (newspapers, flyers, etc.) as deemed appropriate to convey information about regional and international social events such as the annual CW Operator Meetings (assemblies) information booths at ham fairs barbecues and dinner type events involving participation of HSC members. The afore-mentioned print media may also contain photos of HSC members. If an HSC member does not want to be photographed, he/she must inform the organizer of the meeting and if possible the photographer prior to or while attending the event.
- c) <u>On-air bulletins</u>: current information on members regarding their status and their activities in the field of hamradio (i.e. DXpeditions), as well as general Information about hamradio activities (i.e. contests) are regularly published on shortwave
- d) Exchange of HSC data / news within the telegraphy organizations of EUCW (European CW Clubs), to include compiled lists of members (i.e. combined MS excel listings), will be done on an "as needed" basis.

Any data processing, which goes beyond the procedures and methods outlined above will be separately specified and explained within the publication channels of the respective HSC program areas (awards, contests, webpage, member list andministration and monitoring). At no time will pertinent HSC members' data knowingly be published in a context that may be considered derogatory or might reflect negatively on HSC members, or the club as a whole. The overall intent of all public relations activities is to inform the public about the activities of the Radio Telegraphy High Speed Club (founded in 1951) in an objective, well-meaning and conservative manner designed to stimulate other hamradio operators' interest in obtaining the award.

If the applicant for the HSC award does not agree – through his/her signature - with the afore-mentioned data protection policy in its entirety, the award will not be issued. Any applications will not be processed if this document is not signed and dated properly.
